STATEMENT FROM UTAH COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

We support the directive from Governor Herbert for Utahns to stay home and stay safe. All of us should be doing what we can to help fight community spread of COVID-19. The Governor's directive defines a "high-risk individual" as any individual who is age 60 or older, or any individual with a serious underlying medical condition. We feel the directive is especially important for protecting these vulnerable populations.

The Utah County Commission is not issuing enhanced restrictions or enforcement at this time and asks that the county's current public health order continue to be observed.

We are mindful of the businesses and families in our community who are struggling with severe economic losses and changes to their daily lives which have a real effect on health and well-being.

We are grateful for our law enforcement, first responders, healthcare workers and many others who continue to work on behalf of all of us.
