



When to Call 911 vs a Healthcare Provider

Note: Going to the ER with minor symptoms by private vehicle or by ambulance does not guarantee that you will be tested for Covid-19. If you do not have life threatening symptoms you should quarantine at home and call/consult your primary care provider, virtual healthcare provider or urgent care clinician.

Call 911 if the sick person:

- Has difficulty breathing
- Is unable to perform daily activities (i.e. cant make it to the bathroom)
- Is disoriented or has fainted
- Is having difficulty drinking or eating

This is particularly important if the sick person is elderly, has a medical history of heart or lung disease, diabetes, or is otherwise immunologically compromised.

If possible - place a facemask over the person's mouth and nose before the 911 responders arrive.
